THE DEPARTMENT OF ANTHROPOLOGY IS SPONSORING THE FOLLOWING INTERNSHIPS—

Fall (credit-bearing) minimum 10/hrs week. Scheduling is flexible.

These are ethnographically/social science-grounded internships sponsored by the Department of Anthropology. By ethnographically-grounded, we mean focused on the human dimensions of the experience, in which interns will engage in thinking ethically and anthropologically. In order to ensure an anthropologically/social sciences-grounded internship, interns are encouraged to enroll, concurrently (for fall internships), in the **Internship Seminar (ANT451a)** in which the anthropological/social science aspects of the internships will be clarified through group discussion.

Exact content/expectations of the internships will be developed in consultation with both faculty supervisor(s) and internship site supervisor:

Interns may engage in research in archival research at SUNY-Plattsburgh **Special Collections** and/or among Quaker records to harvest materials that can expand knowledge of the House Museum and the people who lived and worked there, especially those whose voices have not yet been heard.

Interns may engage in expanding **media and local outreach** and **networking**, especially to local schools and SUNY-Plattsburgh students. Intern(s) may also work on expanding existing connections between the House Museum with other tourist-related organizations, Adirondack Cultural Coast Alliance, and other heritage sites and museums throughout the region.

Students particularly interested in **ethnography**, can expand museum knowledge about **the ways in which the house itself represents** *culture*—including gender, marriage patterns, religion, economic status, consumption patterns, class, issues of *race* and ethnicity, systems of belief, health and illness, etc. and connecting the culture of past to the culture of the present.

Archaeologically-oriented students may research and work with **artifacts** in order to expand the stories those artifacts tell.

Minimum requirements:

- An interest in anthropology, social sciences, museums, ethnographic & historical research, archaeology and artifact analysis, tourism, education, community outreach. Preference may be given to anthropology majors/minors--however, all interested students are encouraged to apply!
- Maturity, strong work ethic, initiative and the ability to collaborate with diverse groups of people
- Enthusiasm and a willingness to learn about museums, historical realities, human dynamics and culture!

This is a *career-building opportunity* for the right student(s) to learn valuable skills in analysis, project management, training and education, networking and outreach, communication and problem-solving while contributing to a valued North Country community partner.
