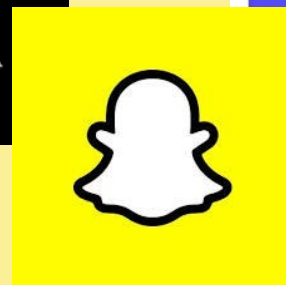
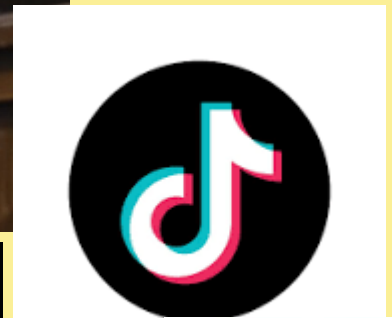


The Institute for Ethics in Public Life presents

Social media has been criticized for causing many social ills including harming mental health of its users (particularly children and teens), its potential for spreading disinformation and misinformation, risks to users' privacy, and undermining our ability to focus. At the same time, it is basically unregulated in the United States. Should that change?
