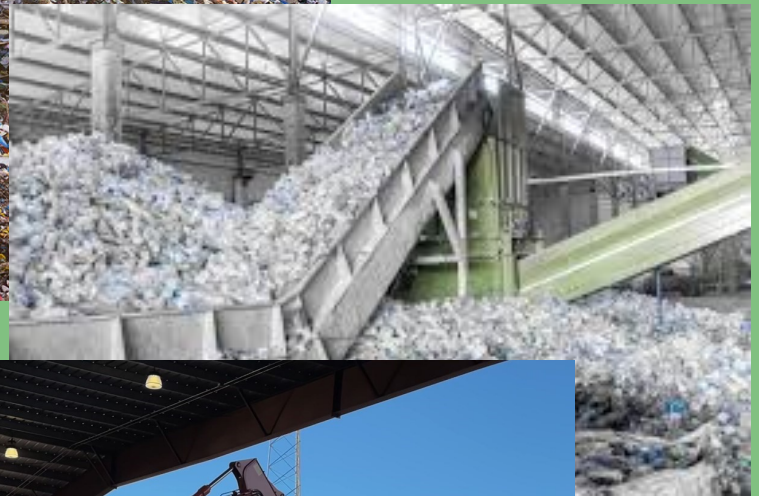


The Institute for Ethics in Public Life presents
