"Talking and Writing About the Holocaust"

What are the issues we confront when we talk and write about the Holocaust? This is not a simple question, in part due to cultural and political differences between Israeli Jews and American Jews. Conventional wisdom presents a picture of identity between Jews of the US and those of Israel, yet the culture is actually vastly different starting with the immediacy of the Holocaust in the lives of Israeli vs. American Jews. The discussion will explore this and a variety of cultural differences that yield cleavages in the two populations even though they ultimately are tied together.



We welcome special guest Stuart Brody, Senior Scholar at the Institute for Ethics in Public Life, to help us understand this important topic. This forum is an opportunity for students, faculty, administrators, staff, alumni, and community members to come together and learn about this issue.
