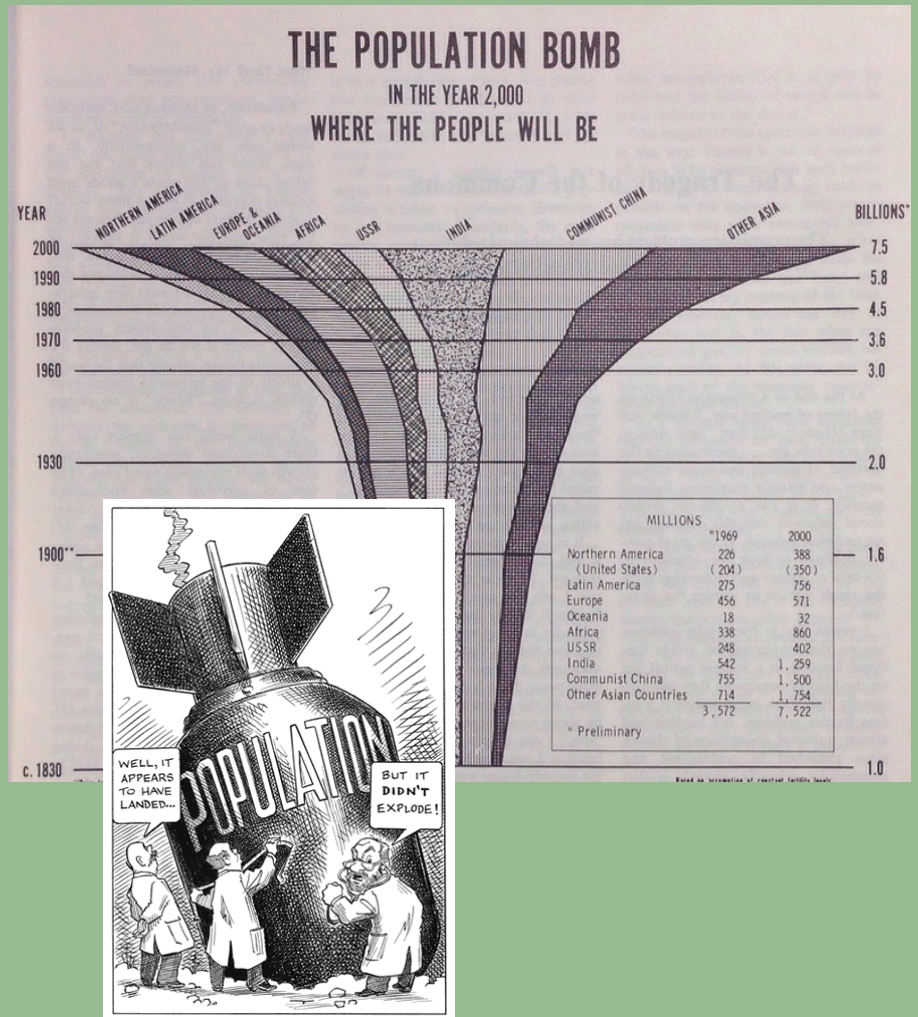


The SUNY Plattsburgh Institute for Ethics in Public Life presents

Abstract from Dr. Cohen: The late Paul Erlich's book, *The Population Bomb*, represents an extreme application of the Malthusian model which suggested that growing human population would inevitably hit against the carrying capacity or finite limit of world food supply. The result would be the end, by starvation and turmoil, of the human species. But not only was Erlich overly pessimistic, he and Malthus were inherently wrong about the application of the carrying-capacity model to human population history.



We welcome special guest Distinguished Professor Emeritus Mark Cohen to help us understand this important topic. This forum is an opportunity for students, faculty, administrators, staff, alumni, and community members to come together and learn about this issue.
